Issues that Impact YOU!

The House Republican Policy Committee, of which I am vice chairman, has been tackling numerous issues that affect your life every day. From tax cuts to growing agriculture and from responsible energy policy to strengthening rural communities, we are addressing the real issues.

One area we explored was tax cuts, which contrasts sharply with the House Democrats' and Shapiro administration's plan to expand government spending. I believe their plan has the potential for serious financial consequences in the future.

House Bill 2388, which I co-sponsored, will slash the state Personal Income Tax (PIT) rate from 3.07% to 2.8% and eliminate the Gross Receipts Tax (GRT) on energy. A PIT reduction will add more money to the wallets of Pennsylvanians and help to spur on the economy, while eliminating the GRT will yield monthly savings on energy costs. Tax cuts are a win for everyone.

I am proud of the work we are doing to bring real issues to the forefront and create responsible solutions to improve the lives of Pennsylvanians. You can learn more about the committee and its work by going to **pagoppolicy.com**.

Proposal Would Benefit Local Communities

If someone dies without a will and without family members, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania becomes the sole beneficiary of the estate. I want to change that.

I believe communities in which the deceased lived would be best served by receiving the inheritance when there is no family to claim it. As a result, I will introduce legislation that would distribute the deceased's estate to nonprofit organizations in the county in which the deceased resided.

This issue was brought to my attention by Ralph Serpe, president and CEO of the Adams County Community Foundation. This homegrown proposal, I believe, does justice for deceased individuals, and allows them to continue to contribute to the community they once called home.

It simply makes sense to me that the money should stay in the county where the person lived and be used for the good of the community. I am hopeful this legislation will soon become law.
